



Assessment Procedure



We carry our a comprehensive assessment that provides us with an informed professional judgement and points to the right intervention. Our procedures involves

- 1. Pre-assessment meeting and interview of first impression and history taking
- 2. Cognitive profiling using the Gibson cognitive test
- 3.A reading, writing and comprehension test.
- 4. A consultation and result sharing session with the client/ client stakeholders and discussion on the intervention plan

Overall number of Assessment and Training

- 147 assessments were carreid out by the Dyslexia Foundation in 2018.
- 22 students started the brain training programme

Dyslexia in Nigeria; Creating Sustainable Solutions, Educational and Workplace Policies


Held in Abuja on October 29th, 2018 It was attended by stakeholders both from the federal ministry of education, labour and productivity, notable law makers, government agencies, public and private and teachers owners. civil society organization, other NGOs, and concerned members of the public. Guest Speakers are: Anthony Alagbile, CPsychol, CPLP, SHRM, MSc.Ed CIPM, (Harvard) and Taiwo Akinlami, LLB, BL LAW

From the conference the points below were highlighted

1. There are no existing policies or laws in Nigeria to protect the rights to education and employment for persons with learning differences like dyslexia. Therefore the need to review the legal frame work is critical and policy makers must be engaged by civil society organizations, schools and parents to act towards the establishment of policy and legal frameworks that will cater for persons with dyslexia in the country.

2. Being the most prevalent learning difference in Nigeria which affects an estimated 32 million persons, dyslexia presents significant consequences for persons affected and Nigeria as a country. Early dyslexia identification, intervention and support across all levels of the education and labour sectors must be made mainstream for sustainable solutions to be proffered.




Capacity building and teachers' training held in Abuja and Lagos on the 30th-31st October and August 1st -3rd 2018 respectively.

We maintained our bi-weekly, newsletters with over 10,000 subscribers sent out by the foundation to educate subscribers about dyslexia and other cognitive disabilities.



In furtherance of our awareness and partnership, the Foundation had its presence at the Lagos Annual teachers' conference organised by Edu-Aid at the Covenant Christian Centre Iganmu on August 25th 2018. The conference had over 5000 education stakeholders in attendance and the Dyslexia Foundation had a strategic stand for its awareness activities.



Our active social media engagement with audiences on Facebook, twitter and Instagram helped spread awareness about dyslexia and other cognitive disabilities to over 200,000 people.

OTHERS

- 1.100,000 thousand units of dyslexia advocacy materials (fliers,) were produced and distributed in 2018.
- 2. Awarness talks and training for Parents and Teachers in Abuja, Lagos, Kano and Kaduna on the signs and symptoms, as well as intervention strategies for dyslexia and other learning disabilities.

The Foundation also plans to create Dyslexia Intervention and Brain Training units in schools, which would help schools to be able to provide intervention






